"Are dads missing out on sure start?"

I have accessed sure start since the birth of my son and have really valued the experience of the groups they run along with the courses I have attended and the guidance they have offered.

The groups have helped support me as a first time mum and given me the opportunity to meet with other mum which has been invaluable.

The courses like first aid and baby massage have built my confidence as well as being very informative.

The guidance I have received has been second to none. The sure start team has been so supportive and have really helped me with finding help through one of the toughest times of my life, becoming a single parent to my baby boy; I can't thank them enough.

The one thing I think is missing from the service is the options for dads to attend; while I know everyone is welcome, dads often work and so their only available time is at weekends. Sure start was part of my bonding process with my little boy and I really feel that dads and working mums miss out.... I certainly feel like I would benefit from a weekend session at SureStart Stapleford but I do think that dads need their own separate session.

The father of my son needs somewhere he can learn to play with his son, somewhere he can build confidence and I can't think of a better place than the place that helped and supported me, Stapleford SureStart. If there was flexibility at weekends maybe even the incredible years course too it would be a great opportunity.

Many thanks for the suggestions and compliments you posted on the 'patient Opinion' website.

It is encouraging for managers and staff to hear what the impact the service offered at Stapleford has had. It certainly appears that the centre has helped you and your child in a number of ways by giving you extra confidence and providing support to you with parenting issues, thank you for this acknowledgement.

On the subject of services and support for Dads, I have spoken to the Children's Centre Coordinator and we are exploring the idea of a group specifically for Dads on a Saturday morning, similarly we are looking into offering a 'Parenting Course' on an evening targeting Dads. We are constantly reviewing the services we offer to identify how better we can meet the needs of local parents and in this way we welcome your suggestions.

Thank you once again for this posting (which I have shared with all staff), we are glad that we were able to assist with supporting you and your child in those early years.

Hi Lion,

Since I last e-mailed you we have been making progress in terms of meeting the needs of Dads within the area, to provide them with the support to manage parenting issues more effectively. As a result of these plans which were 'triggered' by your initial posting we have recently delivered a behaviour management course on a Saturday aimed at Dads. The 1,2,3 Magic course focused on, cognitive therapy and behaviour management and teaches strategies aimed at changing behaviours. We are now planning others courses and activities on a weekend that working Dads are able to participate in.

"Breastfeeding support at Stapleford Sure start"

Below is a copy of a letter we have received at Stapleford Children's Centre from a mum who dropped into the centre to access breastfeeding support from one of our family support workers - Nicola Roulstone. We have contacted mum and she has consented to the letter being made public.

"Dear Nicola

I am writing to you because I wanted to say 'thank you'. I came to Stapleford Children's Centre on Thursday 21st May in order to speak to someone about breastfeeding. There were no peer support ladies available, so I got to speak to you. My baby Daniel, was 2 and a half months old (and I came with Nathan who is just over 2) I had received lots of help with breastfeeding and lots of reassurance that I was doing it correctly but I still wasn't sure everything was happening as it should.

The things you shared with me completely changed my breastfeeding and I spoke of you to everyone I met for the next week! We talked about not looking at the clock or timing feeds but using only Daniels cues for feeding. We also talked about not being able to spoil a baby and offering the breast if I wasn't sure whether he was hungry or not. You observed me feeding Daniel and noticed that he wasn't quite latching on correctly and encouraged me to retrain him to open his mouth wider before latching. You also explained to me how babies feed like it's a three course meal, which was not something I had heard before and explained perfectly the way that Daniel was feeding.

After your advice, I went 'cold turkey' on clock watching and stopped looking at the clock completely (for both time of feed and length of feed). I offered Daniel the breast whenever I wasn't sure if he was hungry or not and I could tell almost immediately that he was much more content. I was much more relaxed about the fact that he was feeding in bits, as you had explained about the different courses of a meal, and I am pleased to say that now, at 4 months, he usually feeds in one block. He is also latching better so I am no longer sore when feeding.

I felt that you completely understood what it is like to be a new mum of 2 children, and what it was like to be breastfeeding Daniel. You were encouraging, reassuring and easy to talk to. I came away feeling that you 'got it' in a way that no one else I had sp0ken to about breastfeeding had.

Thank you so much for all that you did for me that morning. I will never forget it"

All of our staff members are trained to a standard to be able to support mums on a 121 basis but it's always helpful to have a member of staff who has those extra skills and experiences to provide a high standard of service to our families.

You raised an interesting point regarding some activities could do with more people in attendance - at the Children's Centre we recognise that some activities can be 'packed to the rafters' yet some struggle in terms of attendance - we are always trying to promote the work we do to members of the community to increase numbers but also recognise that sometimes families prefer a smaller group as they feel safer with small babies in a group with less children.

Maybe this is something you would like to discuss with other parents at the parents forum meeting about how we get more people to attend sessions yet cater for those who may be less confident about bringing their child to a busy session

"Sleep tight course at Chilwell"

When joining the course my daughter had a terrible bedtime routine. Her average time getting to sleep was 9. 30pm, with the latest time being 11. 50pm. Her body clock was all over the place. She is also a sleepwalker so I would often spend my nights following her around. It's safe to say we were exhausted.

Through the course I have learnt how to retrain her body clock to go to bed at a reasonable time. By the end of the course she was asleep by 8pm every night. We are now using the same techniques to eventually get her asleep by 7pm every night which will be beneficial to her when she begins nursery.

I now enjoy the time we spend together doing the bedtime routine, reading stories etc, and don't dread it because of the battle we had before. Her daytime mood has changed too. She is a lot less grumpy (as am I) due to her getting her full sleep quota. I also have learnt to embrace her sleepwalking, she's safe and I can't stop it so why worry?

"I'm not just a mum!"

Prior to becoming pregnant I had a long established career in offices. I was busy and well-used to the buzz of the workplace. I am a quiet and introverted person by nature and work provided me with solid reasons to get out of the house and talk to other people.

On becoming a mother I learned just how isolating being alone with a baby during the day can be. My friendships melted away without the time or energy to go to out at night. My hair and clothes took a much lower priority than before. I no longer felt "professional". I was losing part of my identity.

I attended baby groups fairly regularly but on my son's first birthday I cried. I was happy with my life and proud of what I had achieved. However part of me was missing- I felt like I hadn't truly connected with any of the other mothers. I needed more conversation during the day, and much as it was hard to admit to myself, I needed time away from my child.

When I saw the confidence course was available I saw it as a way to introduce my son to the idea of being apart from me for short periods of time in the crèche, and to give me something else to think about. Specifically the course has helped me to gain an understanding of where confidence comes from and to be more open to building it for myself. It has enabled me to feel part of a great class of hugely talented and inspirational women who all want to connect and work on ourselves.

The other learners have shared their ideas and experiences over the weeks. We have enthused, and become each other's cheerleaders and at times comforters. I feel privileged to get to know them. In addition to the other students I also include the tutor, Emma Castledine. She is a warm and generous spirit, who has led us and encourages us to want to better ourselves, without judgement.

Several of us moved on together to take Emma's subsequent courses on Transferable Skills and Assertiveness. During these I feel that I kept on building on the work done through the Confidence course. I learned more about myself and my choices in interacting with other people. I also felt inspired to rewrite my CV. I am not currently looking for work outside of the home- but fully recognise that I need to have it ready for when I do want to return to the workforce, as well as my "professionalism", self-identity, and self-worth that had been a little ground-down by motherhood.

One aspect of parenting that we discussed in Transferable Skills, that I had not previously considered is leadership. I now try to remember this when I am with my husband and my son and think we have all benefited as a result. Similarly my relationships with my extended family have all benefited from my taking the assertiveness course.

Our self-development work continued and most recently we have embarked on the Mindfulness course. This proved to be both easy and hard. Easy to understand the basis of it, and so very hard to do in practise in "real life". This is something I plan to take forward by

keeping a gratitude journal to help me recognise more of the positives in my life, and also the mindfulness meditations.

The companionship from the other students that have shared this journey with me has proved to be an enormous boost to my life. This combined with increased self-confidence and assertiveness is all cumulatively having a positive effect on my mental health. (I have previously suffered bouts of depression). The tools it has given me will help me to combat negative feelings at future times- I only wish I had the knowledge of some of the things we covered years ago.

My son has enormously enjoyed his times in the crèche too- so my confidence in being able to be separated from him has also gone up. This has helped me to feel a more rounded person, and a better parent. The play leaders could not have done more for us and I am so grateful for their input into this process.

I want to express a huge thank you to everyone involved in making this happen- the Sure Start Chilwell Children's Central College, the lovely tutor Emma and to the other mums. I am sure we have all made strides together and benefited from knowing each other. I can only hope that other future learners get the opportunities that I have had from such courses. I got part of me by doing this, and I cherish it. I am not just a mum.

Your comments regarding the crèche were pleasing and I will ensure staff get the praise they deserve in terms of the services offered. It is great that you feel you have retrieved some of yourself!

The course was originally identified as a course parents wanted during the summer of 2014 and we acknowledged this by working with our colleagues at Central College to facilitate a confidence building course. This course proved really popular with those who attended (due mainly to the close bond you formed as a group and of course the tutor Emma) and as a result you requested similar future courses. We again responded to this feedback by facilitating transferable work skills, assertiveness and finally the mindfulness course. Your story evidences the impact of these courses for you as an individual and subsequently for your family.

I know from attending the last session you have requested that we could perhaps get partners and dads involved so they could learn some of the strategies you have and I have today discussed this within our leadership team to facilitate a twilight "building health relationships" course to be delivered in the autumn so watch this space.....

I really do apologise for the poor standard of service you have experienced today. Nottinghamshire Healthcare trust commission a county wide taxi service to transport service users to various appointments/access services and this is not the first issue we have had with taxis not turning up on time or on some occasions not at all. We have escalated this to both the taxi service we use and those within the trust who are involved in the commissioning of the services. I will ensure you receive a full and proper response and can only apologise once again.

Just to update you as a result of your posting we have now changed the way in which we deliver our taxi services county wide.

Please see statement below

Changes to taxi companies used by the Trust

From 1 August 2015, new contracts will begin with companies providing the Trust with taxi services. This document explains more about the taxi companies we will be using and how to book journeys from August.

Who are the new Taxi companies we need to use from 1 August?

We have split out the taxi service into two areas.

1. For journeys originating in the north of the county (Mansfield area) then the taxi provider remains ACE/ABC

2. For journeys originating in the south of the county (Nottingham area), there are now two providers to choose from; DG Private Hire and Cloud Cars. Customers can book from either company, but please note Cloud Cars only has a small fleet of vehicles so may not be able to meet all your journey needs.

Why are we changing providers?

The Trust currently uses ACE/ABC as its main provider across the Nottingham and Mansfield area. ACE/ABC subcontracts the majority of Nottingham work to Nottingham Cars. In addition Cloud Cars, a small enterprise also provides a limited service within the Nottingham area.

The current contract with ACE/ABC ended so we ran a competitive tender process to ensure we were still getting value for money for the service. This process also allowed us to use feedback from customers across the Trust on how we could improve the service.

What are the benefits of the new contracts?

Benefits of the new contracts to the Trust include:

- More choice for customers
- A focus on customer service
- No subcontracting arrangements, so all journeys are carried out directly with the contracted provider
- A strong focus on reducing carbon emissions; Cloud Cars Fleet is all Hybrid (petrol / electric) vehicles and DG Private Hire has 20% Hybrid vehicles within its fleet.
- Cheaper fares
- Planned training for taxi drivers of passenger mental health requirements.
- A greater range of vehicles with disabled access.

The car park at Chilwell children's centre has always been a staff only car park. All schools and 95% of Children's Centres in Nottinghamshire also adopt this policy.

By leaving the gates open we have found that this has encouraged families attending the centre to park in the car park when there is space available. Not only this, it has also encouraged those walking to the centre to walk through the car park and not using the pedestrian entrance.

We want to do all we can to help safeguard those attending the centre and reduce the risk of an accident occuring as much as we can. We have had a near miss incidents in the last few weeks where by a car in the car park has narrowly missed a child walking through the car park.

It was based upon the learning from this that we have taken the decision to help reduce this risk by closing the gates to the car park. We have found that the pedestrian entrance to the centre is now used more effectively and we don't know have situations with children walking about in the car park near moving cars.

Jo came out to see me once our daughter had been born, and I have been so impressed with the support that I have received. Jo provided me with lots of useful information such as local groups that I can attend and an emergency contact number should I need to hear back from a health visitor quickly if she wasn't available. Jo also gave us fantastic advice about how to care for our daughter, for example when she had a problem with a 'sticky eye'. Jo really put us at ease and answered any questions that we had.

Jo passed on my details to the local breastfeeding support worker which has been a fantastic help, as it meant that I found out about a breastfeeding support group called Babes which is run at the Stapleford Care Centre. I have been attending that group since my daughter was 2 weeks old and it has been an important activity for me as it has encouraged me to continue to breastfeed even when I was struggling. This is due to the support received from Carole, the support worker, and the other mums who attend the group. Without this group I probably wouldn't get out of the house on a Tuesday! It has also helped me to meet some lovely people.

Jo also told me about the local Surestart Centre in Stapleford which has been a real lifeline for me. This involves a weekly group called Newborn Bundles which gets me out and about on a Monday morning. This is run by a lovely member of staff and volunteers who are very supportive and answer any questions that us new parents may have.

The services that I have accessed have been invaluable. They are the reason that I get out of the house and am meeting lovely new people. They have also helped me to continue to breastfeed my baby successfully. I don't know what I would do without these services and groups
